What is Title I?

- ☐ Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for <u>every</u> child.
- The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year. Bennett Russell is a Title I school.

How Title I Works

- ☐ The federal government provides funding to states each year for Title I.
- □ The Florida Department of Education sends the money to the district.
- ☐ The school district identifies eligible schools and provides Title I funds.
- BRE implements a school-wide program based on the number of students receiving free or reduced breakfast and lunch which means ALL students benefit.

Parent's Rights

- Be involved and request regular meetings to express your opinions and concerns.
- Be provided information on your child's level of achievement on assessments like STAR, Performance Matters Science and FSA in reading/language arts and mathematics.
- Request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher.
- Be informed if your child is taught by a non-highly qualified teacher for 4 or more consecutive weeks.

Must:

- Receive information regarding rules and regulations from appropriate staff member(s).
- □ Receive knowledge and instructions regarding policies and procedures.
- ☐ Be provided with proper supervision both during training and during the school day / school event.
- ☐ Be approved by the School Board or its designee.
- ☐ Be assigned only to staff members requesting their service.
- ☐ Abide by the dress code.
- □ Comply with the requirements of confidentiality and protecting the rights of an individual child's privacy.

Should Not:

- Assume responsibility for the supervision of a class in the absence of a certified teacher.
- ☐ Grade student work on anything other than objective work (i.e.: true / false, multiple choice, etc.).
- ☐ Assume responsibility for the discipline of students.
- Make decisions regarding the relevancy of certain activities or procedures in the attainment of instructional objectives.
- ☐ Contact parents regarding the performance of students or write comments on papers that go home.
- Bring a pre-school or any other child with them when they volunteer.
